Proof of subject-specific, specialisation-related scientific aptitude:

- is not a mandatory requirement for application to the Master's degree programme •
- 10 points are awarded once in the application for valid proof

The following proofs are accepted:

1. Work as a student/scientific assistant at a scientific institution

- The total scope of the activity must be at least 90 hours.
- The activity must not be part of the compulsory curriculum and must be • completed at a scientific institution (university/college, university hospital or other non-university research institution).
- Proof of the activity in the form of a certificate, employment contract or written confirmation of the work performed (incl. number of hours) from the responsible organisation must be submitted.
- The activity must be academically related (activities as student mentors, tutors or assistants in university administration are therefore not recognised).

2. Proof of co-authorship

- A contribution to a peer-reviewed scientific publication in a scientific journal is recognised.
- Proof of publication or, in the case of an ongoing review process, a letter from the editors or an invitation to review the publication must be submitted.

Proof must be submitted by the end of the application deadline.
